Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

1. Let's talk about purity

Pure – *katharos*- (from which we get the word catharsis). The basic meaning of *katharos* is having been made pure by cleansing from dirt, filth, and contamination.

Catharsis is a term used in psychology and counseling for a cleansing of the mind and/or the emotions.

A. Understanding Jesus' usage of the term.

1.) When Jesus spoke of the pure in heart, He spoke of those who love God with all their hearts.

2.) When Jesus spoke of the pure in heart, He spoke of those with an undivided loyalty, and whose inward nature corresponds with their outward profession.
